 - iii. 8 benches to replace existing benches cost approximately \$18,000 plusHST in total
 - iv. Benches will also have 3rd arm ¾ of the way on the bench for easier accessibility. Benches are also slightly taller for same reasons.
 - v. BIA logo to be placed on top left corner of benches. Inset.
 - vi. Colour chosen is walnut / black
 - vii. Delivery date is approx. 8 weeks from order date.
 - viii. Approx \$7,000 of cost to be covered by RED grant.
 - ix. Refurbishing of old benches more to come on this portion.
